#### FROM THE RECTOR - 3rd Sunday of Easter (11 May 2025)

Modern man places a premium on happiness. While being happy is not necessarily a bad thing, the pursuit of happiness can often override more lasting realities: joy, peace, and harmony with God. Since happiness is often equated with fulfilled desires, a person can lose himself in the pursuit of satisfaction constantly feeling agitated and anxious when desires go unfulfilled and not all our wants are satisfied. What the Catholic pursues in his life is the virtue of joy which is that complete fulfillment that is found only in surrendering ourselves freely to God's Divine Providence. It was joy that the apostles experienced when they encountered the Risen Lord. Beyond their understanding and comprehension, in the presence of the Lord who had conquered death through death, they knew only joy in His Presence. We must seek for this joy in our daily lives. It is not easily attained but is always within our grasps if we are willing to follow the Risen Lord wherever He may lead us. So too, we can cultivate Christian joy by our trust and confidence in God's providence. We need to learn to manage our anxieties and to overcome our fears. So too, we need to embrace our sufferings willingly, gladly knowing that to suffer with Christ is to share in His victory over death. With God all things are possible: new life through death; freedom through obedience; joy through sacrifice. Let us continue to rejoice that indeed He has risen.

#### WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are not obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

#### WELLSPRING OF TRADITION

#### THE PAPAL CONCLAVE

A papal conclave is the election process by which a new pope, the visible head of the Catholic Church, is selected.

The pope is the vicar of Christ and successor of St. Peter, the visible leader of the universal Church, against which Our Lord promises the gates of hell will never prevail (Matt. 16:18-19). After a pope dies, a papal conclave commences within three weeks to elect his successor. A conclave is the gathering of the College of Cardinals in which these papal electors choose the next pope.

When a pope dies, there are nine days of mourning, as prescribed in the apostolic constitution that governs the election of a pope, *Universi Domenici Gregis*, which Pope St. John Paul II issued. The Church follows a process established over centuries to elect his successor. The period between two popes is called an *interregnum*, Latin for "between reigns" of two popes.

A two-thirds majority of cardinal electors is needed to elect a pope, no matter how many ballots are required to complete the conclave voting process. In his 2013 motu propio *Normas Nonnullas*, Pope Benedict XVI further decreed that the election of a successor must commence within a maximum of twenty days from when the papal see becomes vacant.

Despite the absence of a Holy Father for a period of time, the faithful take comfort in knowing that the Church continues, reminded that the Lord Jesus Christ, the King of kings (Rev. 17:14), never relinquishes his divine reign over his Catholic Church. He is the Head of the Church and the Pope is His vicar.

The word "conclave" derives from the Latin words *cum clavis*, meaning "with key." After the death of Pope Clement IV in November 1268, the interregnum dragged on for almost three years. The lay faithful of Viterbo, Italy, aided the selection process by locking the cardinal electors in the city's episcopal palace, and also limiting their food supply until they elected a new pope. The new pope endeavored to obviate for the future such scandalous delay by the law of the conclave, which, almost in spite of the cardinals, he promulgated at the fifth session of the Second Council of Lyons in 1274. It is the first occasion on which we meet with the word *conclave* in connection with papal elections.

In a papal conclave, the College of Cardinals gathers to select the next pope. Cardinal electors are eligible to vote for a pope until they reach eighty years of age. The cardinals gather in the Sistine Chapel for a secret election—secret to thwart outside interference and avoid politicking. The cardinals pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance before casting their votes. Although the Holy Spirit guides the decision-making of the Cardinals, the choice is entirely their own.

Once a pope is chosen, and provided he accepts his election, white smoke rises from the Sistine Chapel. The new Roman pontiff selects a papal (or regnal) name, and subsequently he is announced to the world with the words *Habemus papam*! We have a pope!

One important point to note is that, although only the Cardinals cast a vote, the prayers and sacrifices of the entirety of the faithful are important. So continue to pray for the Church!
