# FROM THE RECTOR

The celebration of the apostles Peter and Paul provides the opportunity to contemplate the power of martyrdom to change the world. St. Peter dies upon the cross and St. Paul is beheaded by a sword and the sacrifice of these two great saints continues to bear fruit millennia after their sacrifice. Neither man seems a worthy candidate for the gifts bestow upon, especially St. Peter who is given the keys to the kingdom and then denies Our Lord three times. So too, St. Paul persecutes the early Church and given the great task of evangelizing the gentiles and spreading the message of Christ to the ends of the earth. There is the temptation to ask why the Lord would choose such broken instruments to convey His great truth; however, that can be asked about any of us: why the Lord chooses us, uses us even when we deny and persecute Him. Redemption comes for both of these saints in their eventual obedience to Christ and their willingness to die for the truth. Ss. Peter and Paul are great models of holiness and sacrifice and clearly make manifest that anyone can respond to God's grace and find their place among the blessed. Finally, on this day we offer prayers for the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, that in his obedience to Christ and His Church he will joyfully shed his blood in defense of the truth.

# WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!
