#### **SUMMER SCHEDULE**

#### **THE COMMUNION RAIL**

There have been several incidents where the faithful have fallen from the communion rail after receiving Holy Communion. The severity of the injuries has varied, but sadly this has occurred far too often. I would ask everyone to be attentive to the step up AND down at the communion rail. Please be aware of those with any mobility issues and assist them if no ushers are present. If you bring someone new to the Oratory for Holy Mass, please remind them of the step at the communion rail or if you see someone struggling, please assist them. If the community is more cognizant of this at the time of communion it is hoped that the accidents can cease. Please pray for those who have fallen, especially for a swift recovery from their injuries.

#### **BLESSED ITEMS**

If you wish to have items blessed, please drop them off at the rectory (Mon-Fri, 9am-2pm) and include your name and telephone number. Please make sure all items are clearly marked. Once Msgr. Morris or Fr. Rennier have blessed the items Donna Mueller, Administrative Assistant to the Rector, will call you to let you know the items are ready for pick up (from the rectory office, Mon-Thu, 9am-2pm). Please drop off/pick up items at the front door on Dale Avenue, across from the field parking lot.

#### **WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?**

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

#### WELLSPRING OF TRADITION - ABOUT THE USE OF LATIN IN THE LITURGY

Christine Morhmann discusses the development and use of Latin her book on Liturgical Latin. In a few short essays, she clarifies a few common points, noting that, in any language, there are two reasons for its existence:

- 1. Communication
- 2. Expression

The use of language for communication favors simplicity and clarity. This is our typical, everyday language. We desire to understand and be understood, so we speak an un-ornamented, vernacular language.

It's the 2nd use of language that, in our practical, secular society neglects. The use of language for expression favors poetic depth and symbolic meaning. This type of language connects to eternal, universal truth which cannot be fully contained in language. The language of expression attempts to name that which cannot be named. This is why a song, or poem, or liturgy always has additional layers of meaning and nuance.

The liturgy, because it addresses the God beyond all comprehension, uses the second type of language. We speak to God using what we might call *hieratic expression* (heiratic means a priestly, or heaven-oriented language). This manner of symbolic speech has *always* been used in religion and poetry. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass has never prioritized clarity of communication over the expressiveness of the symbolism. Often, we think that liturgical communication must be "relevant" in order to be of value. This is opposite from the truth. The words of Holy Mass are for God the Father. Not us. The goal of our liturgical language is to make a connection with his glory. The words are meant to be mysterious and transcendent.

The Council of Trent did not mistakenly impose liturgical Latin upon the Church even though it had become a "dead language." The use of stylized liturgical languages was in use in the very beginning of the Catholic Church. It all starts with Homer and the *Illiad*, which was written in a stylized, archaic form of Greek (not the everyday use of the language). He used a hieratic, formal language because his poem interacts with the Greek gods, and the gods did not use common language. Following this, the earliest Greek translation of the Old Testament, called the Septuagint, was written in a stylized hieratic language. It was not written in everyday Greek. The same phenomenon occurs when liturgical Latin began to displace Greek at Holy Mass around the 4th century. The Latin in use at Holy Mass has always prioritized the formal, sacred nature of our speech when directed to God.

So, this all being the case, what exactly is the value of language used as expression? Even when we don't understand every word? Such a language expresses the unity of the community, the transcendence of God, and our reverence for him. We do not speak to God the way we casually speak to each other. Holy Mass is not simply one activity among other activities. It uses a God-directed language to give him thanks, ask mercy, and offer sacrifice. A sacred language, differentiated from everyday speech.

Our Lady of Walsingham, intercede for us who have recourse to thee!
