FROM THE RECTOR

It is always praiseworthy to contemplate the virtue of humility and its supreme importance in the spiritual life. The modern age has unduly influenced us to focus on our needs, wants, and desires. Certainly, everyone should take care of their mental and physical health, but there should be just as much energy devoted to caring for our spiritual health. We best attend to the things of our souls when we are pliable in the hands of God, freely and joyfully doing the things that God requires of us. This pliability can only be realized through a diligent practice of the virtue of humility. St. Francis De Sales reminds us of the need to be humiliated in order to grow in humility. To willingly subject ourselves to situations that humiliate us is counter intuitive. Often times we do what we can to save face and to be thought well of by others. However, we need to be open to those experiences that reduce us in the eyes of men in order to be raised up in the sight of God. We entreat the Lord in the *Introit* for Holy Mass to hear and answer us because we are needy and poor (*quoniam inops et pauper sum ego*). An increase in the virtue of humility allows us to bear any and all sacrifices and makes us prompt and generous in responding to God's Divine Providence. Pray to decrease that the power of God's grace might increase in you!

49th ANNUAL RESPECT LIFE CONFERENCE

The Archdiocese of St. Louis will celebrate Respect Life Month with the **49th Annual Respect Life Conference "Hope in the Gospel of Life"** on Saturday, 4 October at the Cardinal Rigali Center in Shrewsbury.

Starting at 9 am, this inspirational and educational day includes Holy Mass and Rosary, presentations on timely topics from Catholic and pro-life leaders, concurrent teen track for eighth grade and high school students in the afternoon, lunch, and a ministry partner fair. The conference will also offer participants an essential opportunity to network, pray, and fellowship together.

The conference features presentations on Missouri pro-life law and advocacy (including the new Amendment 3), the keynote address, "Hope in the Gospel of Life," and a panel discussion on infertility, IVF, and restorative reproductive medicine. Speakers include *Jamie Morris*, Missouri Catholic Conference executive director, *Jeanne Mancini*, past March for Life president, *Fr. Peter Fonseca*, Archdiocesan bioethics consultant and director of continuing priest formation, and *Mary Bruno*, Creighton Model FertilityCare practitioner, FABM Base cofounder, and Catholic author and speaker.

The concurrent afternoon teen track, co-sponsored by the Archdiocesan Office of Youth Ministry, features presentations by *Kristina Churchman*, Justice for All training specialist, and *Gabriel Cobb*, motivational speaker and triathlete.

The event is \$25 for adults, \$10 for teens, and free for seminarians, religious sisters and brothers (including

ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Catechism classes are held in the St Joseph Room (rectory basement) generally on a bi-monthly basis, the second and fourth Wednesdays from 5:45-6:45 pm.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a questions and answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon and priests.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you happen to be seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

THE COMMUNION RAIL

There have been several incidents where the faithful have fallen from the communion rail after receiving Holy Communion. The severity of the injuries has varied, but sadly this has occurred far too often. I would ask everyone to be attentive to the step up AND down at the communion rail. Please be aware of those with any mobility issues and assist them if no ushers are present. If you bring someone new to the Oratory for Holy Mass, please remind them of the step at the communion rail or if you see someone struggling, please assist them. If the community is more cognizant of this at the time of communion it is hoped that the accidents can cease. Please pray for those who have fallen, especially for a swift recovery from their injuries.

WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!
