FROM THE RECTOR

Love and humility: perfect fundamental companions for excellence in the spiritual life. In the Epistle to the Ephesians, St. Paul exhorts us to utilize the virtue of humility in our walk of life. Whatever your vocation, it is necessary to live it fully through the virtue of humility which will assist you in living out other virtues commensurate with your call. Moreover, the virtue of humility assists us in remaining one in and with Christ forging the bonds of authentic unity, and harmony. A fair question to ask is: how does humility do this? The virtue of humility tempers our passions, and fosters in us a distrust of self, of our minds and intellects. As a consequence of this intellectual humility, we are more inclined to be receptive to the Word and to the words of others, realizing that we do not know everything and remain deferential before the wisdom of the ages and faithful before us. What should always prompt swift humility is a deep and abiding love of the Triune God and the things of God. As the Gospel relates, love is the greatest commandment: we love God above all things and joyfully enter into relationship with Him because He is worthy of our love. It is this same love bestowed upon us that we desire to show/share with others. In humility, our first instinct is not to lord over others, not win at all costs, not expedience and worldliness. Rather, humility allows the Spirit to animate and direct us tempering our passions and making it easier for us to be receptive to grace. The spiritual life is a journey of inches and the Lord provides all the tools needed to successfully reach our final destination.

ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Catechism classes are held in the St Joseph Room (rectory basement) generally on a bi-monthly basis on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Wednesdays from 5:45-6:45 pm.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a questions and answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon and priests.

THE MARIAN CATECHIST APOSTOLATE HOME STUDY COURSE

Pope John Paul II asked St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta to catechize the Missionaries of Charity and prepare them to not only care for the poor but also to evangelize them. Mother Teresa depended on Servant of God Father John Hardon, S.J. to prepare a program for the Sisters that eventually became the Marian Catechist Apostolate home study course. Cardinal Burke assumed leadership of the Apostolate at Fr. Hardon's request. The mission of the Marian Catechist Apostolate is to form catechists doctrinally and spiritually for the teaching of the Catholic Faith. RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in

the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you happen to be seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

THE COMMUNION RAIL

There have been several incidents where the faithful have fallen from the communion rail after receiving Holy Communion. The severity of the injuries has varied, but sadly this has occurred far too often. I would ask everyone to be attentive to the step up AND down at the communion rail. Please be aware of those with any mobility issues and assist them if no ushers are present. If you bring someone new to the Oratory for Holy Mass, please remind them of the step at the communion rail or if you see someone struggling, please assist them. If the community is more cognizant of this at the time of communion it is hoped that the accidents can cease. Please pray for those who have fallen, especially for a swift recovery from their injuries.

BULLETIN DEADLINE (FRIDAYS @ 10AM)

The deadline that LPI has set for our submission of the full bulletin is Tuesdays by 12 Noon each week. Consequently, the new deadline for bulletin submissions from individuals and groups of the Oratory is the prior Friday at 10:00 am.

WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!
