Feast of Christ the King

FROM THE RECTOR

Christus vincit! Christus regnat! Christus imperat! - Christ conquers, Christ reigns, Christ commands. As we celebrate today the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, we make these words our own anthem of praise and adoration. In establishing this great feast, Pius XI intended to not only remind the world of the absolute sovereignty of the Lord but also the necessity for the growth and health of society to hold fast to this truth. It has been over 100 years since the establishment of this feast and if it was necessary then to remind society and culture of the authority of Christ over all men, it is even more necessary in our current age. We see everywhere the devasting effects of governing without recourse to the Lord, of living as if God does not matter, of ejecting the things of God from every aspect of life. Society would have us believe that we no longer have need of God; however, the state of man and the on-going corruption of his soul, clearly indicates that we are in desperate need of God to inhabit and inform every aspect of our existences. Segments of both modern society and the Church Herself are advancing positions and lies antithetical to the truth of Christ and the authentic nature of man: the scourge of abortion continues to wreak havoc on families; the lies of transgenderism erode the living of the truth and destroys authentic language and communication; the celebration of the perversions of homosexuality assist in the destruction of the proper understanding of generative love and the dignity of marriage and family life. It is only through our own adherence to the truth and a sincere desire and willingness to be governed by Christ and His Church that we can hope for conversion of the world and our own conversions. And this is where it must begin: to transform society and culture we must always be in a posture of receptivity to the transforming grace of God in our lives. ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS

All Saints Day is Saturday, 1 November 2025.

In addition to the normal Saturday morning schedule, Holy Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 am.

All Souls Day is transferred to Monday, 3 November 2025.

In addition to the normal weekday schedule Holy Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 pm with confessions before Holy Mass. The faithful are reminded of the indulgences that may be gained during the days of 1 November through 8 November and is applicable to the Poor Souls. A plenary indulgence is gained by visiting a cemetery and praying for the faithful departed. A partial indulgence is granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers from the Office of the Dead and those who recite the prayer "Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace. Amen."

THE ORATORY VESTIBULE

The Rector of the Oratory has requested that any materials left in the vestibule of the Oratory be approved before dissemination. This permission includes materials deemed pious and worthy by the individual leaving the materials. To the person(s) who continues to leave material related to the Miraculous Medal, please contact the Rector of the Oratory before leaving any more materials. The material that has been left has been collected and is being kept in the Oratory offices. This will continue to be the practice of any, and all, materials left in the vestibule or at the doors of the Church without permission: the material will be confiscated or disposed of completely.

CRITICAL/EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The recent violence against Christians, and particularly the Catholic Church, is a serious cause for concern. While being vigilant and aware of the various situations in which we might find ourselves, we must guard ourselves against living fearfully in the world. Assisting in finding this proper balance, the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine has plans in place in the event of a critical or emergency incident. In consultation with the Rector of the Oratory, the Ushers of the Oratory will be the men in charge of responding to any emergency situation. All the faithful of the Oratory are asked to follow their directives in the case of any critical incident or emergency situation. A proper chain of command, led by those with the necessary training, will assist the whole community if a critical and/or life-threatening situation should present itself. I am grateful to Dr. Robert Morgan and Tim Turtine for their leadership and expertise along with other members of the community and all of the ushers for undertaking this necessary and serious responsibility. Finally, if any member of our community has concerns, please communicate those directly to Rector.

CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY

All Oratory Faithful are invited to consecrate themselves to Jesus through Mary on Monday, 8 December, the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Following any of the Holy Masses of that feast day, the faithful are welcome to kneel at the Communion rail in front of the Altar of Our Lady and silently pray their consecration. They should then sign their consecration prayer with their full name. Note: the 33-day preparation period begins on 5 November. Booklets to help guide the faithful through the 33-day preparation will be handed out by Girls' Guild members following the 8:00 am and 10:00 am Masses on Sunday, 2 November and will be available in the vestibule thereafter.

The Oratory resumed the offering of Confessions on Sunday mornings (effective 7 September 2025). Confessions will be heard from 7:30 until 9:00 am (approximately) and again from 9:15 am until 10:30 am. This new schedule will allow the priests celebrating the two early Holy Masses to be available for confession. So too, when Msgr. Witt hopefully returns to us, he will be able to assist as well. There will be some Sundays that will need to be adjusted because only two priests will be celebrating Holy Masses that day. Signs will indicate those Sundays as they happen. Please remember that confessions are heard Monday - Friday at 11:00 am; Wednesdays at 5:00 pm; and Saturday mornings

at 7:00 am. Finally, please continue to pray for Msgr. Witt as he works toward a full recovery.

ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Catechism classes are held in the St Joseph Room (rectory basement) generally on a bi-monthly basis on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 5:45-6:45 pm.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a questions and answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon and priests.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you happen to be seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

WELLSPRING OF TRADITION, FROM THE RECTOR: CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY

As we approach the feast of the Immaculate Conception, I would like to offer some words to our community about the devotional practice of Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary. Through the centuries, the Church has seen several different forms of this devotion, but the essential idea has always been that Christians place themselves and all of their goods, both material and spiritual, into the hands of Our Lady in order that she might direct their lives in every way and help them live their Baptismal vows unto sainthood.

In his work *True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary*, St. Louis de Montfort elaborates on Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary. In the following passage, he sums up the devotion:

"This devotion consists in giving oneself entirely to Mary in order to belong entirely to Jesus through her. It requires us to give:

- Our body with its senses and members;
- Our soul with its faculties;
- Our present material possessions and all we shall acquire in the future;
- Our interior and spiritual possessions, that is, our merits, virtues, and good actions of the past, the present, and the future.

In other words, we give her all that we possess both in our natural life and in our spiritual life as well as everything we shall acquire in the future in the order of nature, of grace, and of glory in heaven. This we do without any reservation, not even of a penny, a hair, or the smallest good deed. And we give for all eternity without claiming or expecting, in return for our offering and our service, any other reward than the honor of belonging to our Lord through Mary and in Mary, even though our Mother were not–as in fact she always is—the most generous and appreciative of all God's creatures."

Sometimes men and women are given pause by the radical demand that Marian Consecration makes on their lives. For instance, when a man consecrated to Our Lady prays or sacrifices for particular intentions, the merits of his prayers and sacrifices may be redirected by Our Lady Herself toward other good ends. By consecrating himself to Our Lady, a man agrees to allow Her to dispose of all of the merits of his life on earth in the way that She deems best. Consecration to Our Lady is, then, the greatest act of trust. However, it may help to recall that the man who consecrates himself to Our Lady consecrates Himself to the Mother of God, the Mediatrix of all Graces. All good that comes to any Christian soul, comes through Our Lady. To pledge our radical, even blind trust in Her, unlocks for us a shower of graces that we could never conceive of as requests in our own faulty prayers. In other words, we will always profit by allowing Our Lady to manage the investment of our merits. The only requirement is that we allow Her to dispose of our goods in Her way, which is so much wiser than our own.

To learn more about Total Consecration to Jesus through Mary, read St. Louis de Montfort's excellent book, *True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary*. If you decide that you would like to make a total consecration of yourself to Jesus through Mary, plan on following the traditional practice of making a 33-day preparation for your consecration. If you wish to make your consecration on the feast of the Immaculate Conception with many other Oratory faithful, the day to begin your preparation is Wednesday, 5 November.
