FROM THE RECTOR

The Lord gives life by conquering death. Our lives of trust and confidence should reflect this truth. The reality of Christ’s victory over death and sin is not only a future reality but also the foundation of our daily lives. In our Gospel today, we witness two people whose faith moves them to seek the Lord to assist with illness and death. This manifested faith involves a profound trust that God will answer their prayers according to His will and providence. In both instances the Lord’s mercy moves Him to heal the woman and to raise the child from death to life. Christ desires to do the same for each of us, but we must do our part. First, we must live lives of great faith and trust that the Lord will answer our prayers according to His will and providence. Second, we must approach the Lord in times of need. It is foolish to trust in our own devices, to ask men to accomplish for us things only God can do. When confronting illness and suffering, or, more serious still, the sadness and sorrow of death, human comfort can only do so much. Stop searching among men for the things that only God can provide. There is no reason for us to doubt the goodness of the Lord and to turn to His tender love and mercy in times of need. Have faith and courageously live your lives. And when the day of death arrives, pray that you have been God’s good and faithful servant whom He welcomes into His kingdom.

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BLESSING & IMPOSITION OF THE BROWN SCAPULAR

Twice a year, at Advent and Lent, the Oratory invests its faithful in the Brown Scapular. To assist those who desire to have a scapular blessed and imposed on them, **on the First Sunday of Advent, 30 November 2025 after the 8:00 am Holy Mass**, there will be the blessing and imposition of scapulars on those who present themselves at the communion rail. Please bring your own scapular, have it unwrapped and off your neck if you are already wearing it. As there might be a great number of people presenting themselves for this blessing, the only thing that will be blessed this day is the scapular. Any questions, please contact Msgr. 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SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

The Immaculate Conception will be celebrated this year on Monday, 8 December 2025. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. To assist the Oratory in fulfilling this obligation, in addition to the normal daily Mass schedule, Holy Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 pm as well; **NO** confessions preceding the evening Mass. The office will be closed on Monday as well.

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THE RORATE CAELI MASS

When: 20 December 2025 @ 6:30 am

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn.

The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8:

"Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem." ("Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour.")

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honor, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.

OSGA CHRISTMAS GIVING TREE 2025

The Christmas Giving Tree, sponsored by The OSGA Almonry, is a way for the Oratory faithful to receive or contribute to local needs during the Advent and Christmas season. Starting Sunday, 30 November, needs will be displayed on ornaments in the vestibule for the faithful to take and fulfill. All names will be kept anonymous and gifts will be distributed prior to Christmas.

CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION

For the celebration of the Lord's Birth on Christmas Day, the Oratory will have the opportunity to celebrate three Sung Masses. The principal Holy Mass will be at Midnight. This will be Solemn High Mass assisted by our choir. On Christmas morning, Holy Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 am and 8:00 am.

PLANNING AHEAD: OFFICES CLOSED

The offices of the Oratory will be closed starting on 23 December 2025 and will return to normal business hours on Monday, 5 January 2026. In advance, blessings to everyone on the upcoming Holy Days.

ESTATE PLANNING WITH THE ORATORY

Have you prayerfully considered including The Oratory of Saints Gregory & Augustine in your will or estate plan? You can name the Oratory as a beneficiary of a gift, such as a bequest in your will, or a beneficiary on an IRA or life-insurance policy. Any amount helps the Oratory continue its mission of traditional worship and care for souls. Talk with your attorney or financial advisor for more details.

CONSIDER AN IRA GIFT TO THE ORATORY IN 2025

If you are 70½ or older, you can make a gift to the Oratory of Saints Gregory & Augustine directly from your traditional IRA. This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). In 2025, you can give up to \$108,000 per person tax-free to qualified charities. Married couples with separate IRAs can each give up to \$108,000. A QCD may lower your taxes and it counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution once you are required to take one (generally starting at age 73). To do this, ask your IRA provider to send the gift directly to the Oratory. Please consult your tax advisor for more details.

CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY

All Oratory Faithful are invited to consecrate themselves to Jesus through Mary on Monday, 8 December, the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Following any of the Holy Masses of that feast day, the faithful are welcome to kneel at the Communion rail in front of the Altar of Our Lady and silently pray their consecration. They should then sign their consecration prayer with their full name. To learn more about prayers of Consecration to Jesus through Mary and the 33-day preparation for consecration, please see the Wellspring of Tradition section of this bulletin. Note: the 33-day preparation period began on 5 November but starting a few days late is allowed. Remaining available booklets to guide the faithful through the 33-day preparation are available in the vestibule.

CRITICAL/EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The recent violence against Christians, and particularly the Catholic Church, is a serious cause for concern. While being vigilant and aware of the various situations in which we might find ourselves, we must guard ourselves against living fearfully in the world. Assisting in finding this proper balance, the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine has plans in place in the event of a critical or emergency incident. In consultation with the Rector of the Oratory, the Ushers of the Oratory will be the men in charge of responding to any emergency situation. All the faithful of the Oratory are asked to follow their directives in the case of any critical incident or emergency situation. A proper chain of command, led by those with the necessary training, will assist the whole community if a critical and/or life-threatening situation should present itself. I am grateful to Dr. Robert Morgan and Tim Turbine for their leadership and expertise along with other members of the community and all of the ushers for undertaking this necessary and serious responsibility. If anyone is interested in serving in this capacity, please contact Dr. Morgan at ostiarri@oratorysga.org to become an usher which will facilitate your participation. Finally, if any member of our community has concerns, please communicate those directly to Rector.

THE ORATORY VESTIBULE

The Rector of the Oratory has requested that any materials left in the vestibule of the Oratory be approved before dissemination. This permission includes materials deemed pious and worthy by the individual leaving the materials. To the person(s) who continues to leave material related to the Miraculous Medal, please contact the Rector of the Oratory before leaving any more materials. The material that has been left has been collected and is being kept in the Oratory offices. This will continue to be the practice of any, and all, materials left in the vestibule or at the doors of the Church without permission: the material will be confiscated or disposed of completely.

STREET PARKING

As our community continues to grow, parking on Sundays is at a premium, especially at the 10:00 am Holy Mass. If you are parking on the street, please do not block any

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driveways. It was recently communicated that a driveway was blocked and the person living there was unable to get out. Fortunately, this neighbor was willing to wait until the conclusion of Holy Mass. Sadly, not all of our neighbors are happy about our presence or our growth and it is important that we work with them even if they do not want to work with us. Let's not provide any opportunity to cause or create a problem. Please be conscious of working to be good neighbors and do not block drives or park in places that are not available to us.

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ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Catechism classes are held in the St Joseph Room (rectory basement) generally on a bi-monthly basis on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 5:45-6:45 pm.

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The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a question and answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon and priests.

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NEW PRO-LIFE COORDINATOR

The whole community would like to thank Rory (Aurora) Miller for serving as the coordinator of Pro-Life activities for the Oratory for the past several years. Rory has done a great job leading the Oratory's involvement in fostering the culture of life. She has elected to step down from this position and we are in need of a new volunteer coordinator.

The duties of the position in its current configuration include:

- Attends diocesan pro-life meetings at Rigali Center.
- Coordinates 40 Days for Life twice each year.
- Goes to monthly meetings at the pro-life Advocacy group.
- Gathers information about upcoming Pro-Life events and submits this for posting and publication at the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine.

The new coordinator is encouraged to explore other avenues for the Oratory community to remain involved in and part of the Pro-Life efforts of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

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RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you happen to be seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail

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and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.
