FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION: CLARIFICATION AND APOLOGY

It has long been a desire of mine as rector to have more Eucharistic Adoration at the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine. For a brief time, several years ago, we did have extended periods of adoration on Wednesdays and Fridays; unfortunately, the community was unable to sustain that with consistent adorers. Sadly, there were times when Our Lord was left alone in Church which of course should not and cannot ever happen. I had hoped that the community could begin adoration again with the First Friday of each month for 2026. It was anticipated that we would start on Friday, 2 January 2026. Again, we were unable to find a sufficient number of the faithful to be present at Adoration and to fill all of the hours. I made the decision to cancel adoration. This decision, however, was not communicated to all those who had signed up and who came to Church on 2 January expecting Eucharistic Adoration. I am truly sorry for any inconvenience this confusion caused and I am hopeful that those who did commit would be willing to do so again going forward. To that end, I am hopeful that we can find a sufficient number of the faithful to spend time with our Lord on Friday, 6 February 2026 from 1:00 pm until 6:00 pm. Hopefully, Adoration will take place every First Friday afternoon going forward to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus. CATECHESIS ON CONFESSION

The beginning of the new calendar is an opportune time to offer a few words on the nature of our confessions. Particularly that when we present ourselves for confession, it is after a complete examination of conscience striving for a full and integral confession aware of our sins and based not on emotion only. So too, those who make frequent confession (which is encouraged) should examine their consciences for the sin of presumption.

The Catechism of the Council of Trent provides a thorough and complete explication of the Sacrament of Penance. I want to draw particular attention to the exhortation that confession should be complete and entire. The Church teaches us that we are responsible for confessing all of our mortal sins in both number (how often) and kind (nature of the sin itself). As such when we come for confession, we should not only present those sins that are on our hearts or that have easily come to mind but also confess all sins we can recall after a thorough examination of conscience.

I encourage everyone to access a thorough and complete guide for examining your conscience. This will assist you in recalling your serious sins as well as venial sins which also work against growing in holiness. A good examination of

conscience will also provide the requisite detachment from the emotions that are often associated with the sins for which we are guilty. There are situations where we might feel bad about a particular interaction, situation, but no sin was involved and then there are times when we have grown so accustomed to our sins that we no longer feel guilt about them and fail to confess them. Prepare well for the sacrament so that you can also use well the graces received.

CRITICAL/EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The recent violence against Christians, and particularly the Catholic Church, is a serious cause for concern. While being vigilant and aware of the various situations in which we might find ourselves, we must guard ourselves against living fearfully in the world. Assisting in finding this proper balance, the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine has plans in place in the event of a critical or emergency incident. In consultation with the Rector of the Oratory, the Ushers of the Oratory will be the men in charge of responding to any emergency situation. All the faithful of the Oratory are asked to follow their directives in the case of any critical incident or emergency situation. A proper chain of command, led by those with the necessary training, will assist the whole community if a critical and/or life-threatening situation should present itself. I am grateful to Dr. Robert Morgan and Tim Turtine for their leadership and expertise along with other members of the community and all of the ushers for undertaking this necessary and serious responsibility. STREET PARKING

As our community continues to grow, parking on Sundays is at a premium, especially at the 10:00 am Holy Mass. If you are parking on the street, please do not block any driveways. ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Catechism classes are held in the St Joseph Room (rectory basement) generally on a bi-monthly basis on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 5:45-6:45 pm.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a question and answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related

questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon and priests.

The whole community would like to thank Rory (Aurora) Miller for serving as the coordinator of Pro-Life activities for the Oratory for the past several years. RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you are seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

WELLSPRING OF TRADITION: EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION OF MOVEABLE FEASTS

Epiphany is the last principal feast before the beginning of the Easter cycle. The *Pontificale Romanum (Pars III. De Publicatione festorum Mobilium in Epiphania Domini)* provides rubrics, text, and chant for how to announce the date of Easter and of the main movable feasts of the year on this day. This follows a tradition that dates back to the early days of the Church, when calendars were rare. The Patriarch of Alexandria, where the most skilled Christian astronomers lived, had the mission to send the date of the Paschal solemnity to other Eastern Patriarchs and to the Roman Pontif, who then informed the metropolitans of the West.

The Council of Nicaea is said to have formalized the practice, so that everyone everywhere should celebrate it on one and the same day. Although there is no mention of the fixing of the date of Easter in the canons of the Council of Nicaea which have been preserved, we know that the issue was discussed and decided by the council from various documents published afterwards. It soon became a practice for bishops to publish annually, on 6 January, an *Epistola festalis*, a pastoral letter in which were announced the dates of Easter and movable feasts of the current year.

Many Fathers of the early Church speak of the announcement of the date of Easter on the feast of the Epiphany. The Fourth Council of Orleans in 541 and that of Auxerre in 578 are good witnesses of this use in Gaul, and broadly, in the West. In the old Parisian Breviary, at the end of the office of a prime, a canon from decisions of the holy councils used to be read on Sundays & holidays. Here's the one for the Epiphany:

The Council, guided by the inspiration of a God full of goodness for men, ruled that the priests will celebrate at the same time the holy Easter, and that every year on the day of Epiphany the people in the church will be informed of this solemn feast... Let the priests before the Epiphany send deputies to the bishop to be informed by him of the beginning of Lent, and to be able to instruct the faithful upon that on the day of Epiphany.

The Parisian and Ambrosian rites have shorter formulae for this announcement. But the Roman rite has a slightly expanded formula, known from its first word as the *Noveritis*. In addition to the date of Easter are also added those of Septuagesima, Ash Wednesday, Ascension, Pentecost and First Sunday of Advent. The Roman chant uses the same melody as the *Exultet* of the Easter Vigil, which gives a taste of the Easter joy to the publication of the date of Easter. This same idea is developed by Dom Prosper Guéranger in his great commentary, *The Liturgical Year*.

This custom, which dates from the earliest ages of the Church, shows both the mysterious connection which unites the great Solemnities of the year one with another, and the importance the Faithful ought to attach to the celebration of that which is the greatest of all, and the centre of all Religion. After having honoured the King of the universe on the Epiphany, we shall have to celebrate him on the day which is now announced to us, as the conqueror of death.

At the Oratory, we will chant this announcement after the Gospel at Solemn Mass on 6 January, the feast of Epiphany. Here is the text in Latin and English

Noveritis, fratres carissimi, quod annnuente Dei misericordia sicut de Nativitate Domini Nostri Iesu Christi gavisi sumus, ita et de Resurrectione ejusdem Salvatoris nostri gaudium vobis annuntiamus. Die prima decima Februarii erit Dominica in Septuagesima. Decima octava Februarii dies Cinerum et initium jejunii sacratissimae Quadragesimae. Quinta Aprilis sanctum Pascha Domini nostri Iesu Christi cum gaudio celebrabimus. Decima quarta Maji erit Ascensio Domini nostri Iesu Christi. Vigesima quarta ejusdem Festum Pentecostes. Die quarta Junii Festum sacratissimi Corporis Christi. Vigesima nona Novembbris Dominica prima Adventus Domini nostri Iesu Christi, cui est honor et gloria in saecula saeculorum. Amen.	Know, dearest brethren, by the gift of God's mercy, as we have rejoiced for the birth of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, so also we announce to you joy for the Resurrection of the same Our Savior. On the first day of February will be Septuagesima Sunday. On the eighteenth of February, the day of Ashes, and the beginning of the fast of most holy Lent. On the fifth of April, we will celebrate with joy the holy Easter of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. On the fourteenth of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. On the twenty-fourth of the same month, the feast of Pentecost. On the fourth of June, the feast of the most holy Body of Christ. On the twenty ninth of November, the first Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, to whom are honor and glory forever and ever. Amen."
