FROM THE RECTOR

Modern man places a premium on happiness. While being happy is not necessarily a bad thing, the pursuit of happiness can often override more lasting realities: joy, peace, and harmony with God. Since happiness is often equated with fulfilled desires, a person can lose himself in the pursuit of satisfaction constantly feeling agitated and anxious when desires go unfulfilled and not all our wants are satisfied. What the Catholic pursues in his life is the virtue of joy which is that complete fulfillment that is found only in surrendering ourselves freely to God’s Divine Providence. It was joy that the apostles experienced when they encountered the Risen Lord. Beyond their understanding and comprehension, in the presence of the Lord who had conquered death through death, they knew only joy in His Presence. We must seek for this joy in our daily lives. It is not easily attained but is always within our grasps if we are willing to follow the Risen Lord wherever He may lead us. So too, we can cultivate Christian joy by our trust and confidence in God’s providence. We need to learn to manage our anxieties and to overcome our fears. So too, we need to embrace our sufferings willingly, gladly knowing that to suffer with Christ is to share in His victory over death. With God all things are possible: new life through death; freedom through obedience; joy through sacrifice. Let us continue to rejoice that indeed He has risen.

FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS DEVOTION

“Look My daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console Me and announce in My name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making Reparation to Me.” *Our Lady to Lucia on December 10, 1925*

In response to Our Lady’s request for the devotion of reparation to her Immaculate Heart, all are invited to join us in reciting the Holy Rosary on First Saturdays, beginning 2 May. The Rosary will begin at 7:40 am, finishing in time to allow for the additional 15 minutes of private meditation on any of the mysteries of the Rosary with the intention of making reparation to Our Lady. SUMMER SCHEDULE

While this is several months away, to allow the faithful of the Oratory to plan accordingly, the Oratory will implement a summer schedule again. Beginning on 29 June 2026 and concluding on 14 August 2026 the Oratory will have daily Holy Mass at 12:15 pm (NO 6:30 am) with Confessions at 11:00 am. The Saturday and Sunday schedules will remain the same. The offices hours during this time will be Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am until 2:30 pm. The offices will be closed on Fridays. These scheduling changes allow the priests of the Oratory to take vacation and more importantly to make their canonical retreats. So too, the changed office hours will allow our dedicated staff time for vacation.

BLESSING OF ITEMS

Going forward, the blessings of religious items will take place after the 8:00 am Holy Mass at St. Joseph Altar. This will happen on the Second Sunday of each month. In this way, items can be blessed and retrieved in a more timely manner. This process will replace bringing items to the rectory to be blessed. **ALL ITEMS TO BE BLESSED MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE ST. JOSEPH ALTAR ON THE 2nd SUNDAY OF EACH MONTH BEFORE HOLY MASS.** Those who desire to have items blessed should bring them to the St. Joseph Altar before the 8:00 am Holy Mass with their names clearly marked on the items to be blessed. These items should be left on the St. Joseph Altar. If there are a large number of items, they can be placed around the altar but should not impede the distribution of Holy Communion. Two blessings will be given: one for rosaries and one for all other items grouped together. There is no need to take items from their packaging. **This new process began Sunday, 8 February 2026, therefore the rectory is no longer accepting items to be blessed (as of 9 February).**

**** CATECHISM CLASSES WILL RESUME ON 27 MAY****
We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Catechism classes are held in the St Joseph Room (rectory basement) generally on a bi-monthly basis on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 4:00-5:15 pm.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a question-and-answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon, and priests.

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph’s altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you are seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

WELLSPRING OF TRADITION: The Apostolate of Widowhood

It seems odd to think about widowhood as an apostolate in the Church, but this is precisely how St. Paul describes it in his letter to St. Timothy. What he has in mind is not the denial of the grief of a particularly difficult period of life. He isn't pretending that being a widow is a good thing. What St. Paul indicates, though, is that in whatever circumstance of life we find ourselves in, all the way to death itself, God is victorious over that situation and can bring good out of it.

In any state of life, every single one of us has a positive, affirming vocation. Everyone is a gift to the Church. The gifts that widows can offer are unique and incredibly valuable. Older widows tend to have time and love.

In earlier stages of life, the busyness of work, marriage, and child-raising keep us busy. It is later in life that more and more time is freed up for prayer and intercession. St. Paul, in his letter to Timothy, acknowledges that some widows become busybodies who engage in idle gossip and stir up trouble. These temptations only become more acute when widows feel abandoned and lonely, which is why the Bible repeatedly instructs us to care for our widows and not forget about them.

I think what's important, though, is to be clear that widows have a positive, extremely valuable vocation. They make contributions to the health and vitality of the Church that no one else can.

For instance, widows have time and energy to pray. They are the heart of the community. They are the parishioners who come early for quiet prayer, who lead the rosary, who keep adoration going (and so much more). There are widows out there in every parish who probably pray more than the priest does and maybe even spend more time in the church than he does. There is a reason that a widow (Anna) who spent time in constant prayer was one of the first to recognize Christ as the Son of God. Her prayer was prophetic and powerful.

One final way that widows are invaluable is their love for the parish children. A healthy parish has people of all ages and this includes widows, who are natural "parish grandparents" for the young families. I've seen older widows gladly take a baby off a young mother's hands for a spell.

These reasons, and probably more I haven't listed, lie behind the early Church tradition of encouraging the apostolate of widows. St. Paul takes this very seriously and even explains the qualifications required; A widow should be enrolled if she is at least sixty years old, had been faithful to her husband, and well known for good deeds such as bringing up children, entertaining strangers, washing the feet of the saints, imparting relief to the afflicted, and devoting herself to every good work. From his list, we get an idea of the work that only widows can accomplish.

Yes, transitioning to a new state of life is never easy, and widowhood is marked by its particular form of suffering. However, it also opens up new opportunities to love God and the people around them. Widows have a vital role to play and the Church is tremendously blessed by them.
