FROM THE RECTOR

The Lessons for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost encourage reflection on the sacraments of baptism and the Holy Eucharist. The sacramental life of the Church, especially these two great sacraments, provides us the means by which we not only receive sanctifying grace from God but also through that grace we are able to render worthy praise and adoration to Him. As Paul reminds the Romans, baptism is the means by which we are able to fully share in the Paschal Mystery of our Savior. To die with Christ in baptism is also to live with Him and the restored, reborn life He gained for us on the Cross. Of course, baptism and confirmation are the proper preparation for the reception of the Most Holy Eucharist. The Lord gives us Himself in the Holy Eucharist so that we will have constant contact with the powerful effects of the Cross. It is important to remember that the sacraments really and truly provide the graces they signify. In baptism we are set free from original and all sin and grafted unto Christ; in the Most Holy Eucharist we receive the living God Himself who desires to be with us in the most intimate of ways. It is of fundamental importance that we strive to live our faith in the Eucharist, and that we are able to make reparation for the many offenses against our Eucharistic Lord. We are well aware that many self-professed Catholics either believe the Eucharist is a symbol or have no faith in the Eucharist at all. The best way to stem this tide of doubt and ignorance is to comport ourselves as people of faith in the presence of the Lord. This involves how we prepare for Holy Mass; what we wear to participate in the sacred mysteries; how we dispose ourselves, through the sacrament of confession, to be worthy to receive the living God. We should never take for granted the gifts given to us in our Catholic faith through all the sacraments, but especially through baptism and the Most Holy Eucharist. So, too, we should guard against underestimating the power of God's grace bestowed upon us sacramentally. Our hope for the world, our Church and ourselves is founded on these tangible manifestations of God's love for us. Let us strive to live this week alive in Christ Jesus our Lord!

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HOLY COMMUNION – MOBILITY ISSUES

In order to facilitate a smooth and orderly flow for the distribution of Holy Communion, the section of pews immediately in front of the Saint Joseph Altar has been widened to accommodate those with mobility issues. If you are dealing with any type of mobility issue and/or use some form of assistance for movement (long term/short term) you are asked to sit in that section of the Church for Holy Mass. During the distribution of Holy Communion, you are asked to remain in the pew. At the conclusion of Holy Communion, the priest/deacon will bring Holy Communion to you in the pew. This process will allow for an orderly procession for distribution; it will minimize the movements of those with mobility issues and hopefully limit the possibility of falling while trying to approach the communion rail. If that section is already full when you arrive at Church, you are asked to sit as close to the front as possible and to present yourself at the end of the distribution of Holy Communion. This section will be exclusively reserved for the convenience of those with mobility concerns. Those faithful without issues are asked to find seating in another part of the Church and to leave that section free for those who need it. In advance, thank you for your flexibility and attentiveness to this new process.

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SUMMER SCHEDULE (29 JUNE -14 AUGUST)

PLEASE NOTE that the summer schedule began on Monday, 29 June 2026 and will conclude on 14 August 2026 the Oratory will have **daily Holy Mass at 12:15 pm (NO 6:30 am) with Confessions at 11:00 am**. The Saturday and Sunday schedules will remain the same. The offices hours during this time will be Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am until 2:30 pm. **The offices will be closed on Fridays**. These scheduling changes allow the priests of the Oratory to take vacation and more importantly to make their canonical retreats. So too, the changed office hours will allow our dedicated staff time for vacation.

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FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS DEVOTION

"Look My daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. 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PRAYER OF THE PEOPLE

On 18 July at the Cathedral Basilica, all are warmly invited to attend the Bicentennial Jubilee Mass at 10:00am, marking 200 years since the establishment of the Diocese of St. Louis.

The Prayer of the People is an archdiocesan-wide, prayerful and unifying initiative in preparation for this celebration. In the months leading up to the Jubilee Mass, the faithful are invited to submit personal prayer intentions, which will be gathered from across the Archdiocese and symbolically presented during the entrance procession.

Through the Prayer of the People, the faithful of every parish community will be represented in this historic moment. By bringing these intentions together, we express our commitment as one Church and entrust our prayers, hopes, and gratitude to our Lord, Jesus Christ.

The faithful may submit prayer intentions (anonymously) in one of two ways: (1) online portal: intentions submitted through the secure online portal on the Bicentennial website; (2) written prayer intentions may be placed in the collection basket or dropped off at the office until 7/13.

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CELL PHONES

There has been an increasing number of cell phones ringing during Holy Mass. Please be sure to silence your cell phones before entering Church. Thank you for your cooperation.

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BLESSING OF ITEMS

As a reminder, the blessings of religious items will take place after the 8:00 am Holy Mass at St. Joseph Altar on the 2nd Sunday of each month. Those who desire to have items blessed should bring them to the St. Joseph Altar **before** the 8:00 am Holy Mass with their names clearly marked on the items to be blessed. These items should be left on the St. Joseph Altar. If there are a large number of items, they can be placed around the altar but should not impede the distribution of Holy Communion. Two blessings will be given: one for rosaries and one for all other items grouped

together. There is no need to take items from their packaging.

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ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Please register with the Oratory and confirm class times and days. Generally, catechumens who are actively in formation meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 4:00-5:15 pm in the St. Joseph Room (rectory basement). If you are not currently in formation and would like to begin attending the classes please contact the office.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a question-and-answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon, and priests.

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RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you are seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

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WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

This permission includes materials deemed pious and worthy by the individual leaving the materials. To the person(s) who continues to leave material related to the Miraculous Medal, please contact the Rector of the Oratory before leaving any more materials. The material that has been left has been collected and is being kept in the Oratory offices. This will continue to be the practice of any, and all, materials left in the vestibule or at the doors of the Church without permission: the material will be confiscated or disposed of completely.
