FROM THE RECTOR

Today's Gospel for the Twelfth Sunday is the parable of the Good Samaritan. Modern exegesis of this great parable has exclusively focused on the manner we are to care for our brothers and sisters, and the generosity that should be the hallmark of all Catholic believers. While there is definitely truth in this understanding, it is preceded by the more traditional understanding of the Good Samaritan as a manifestation and explanation for Christ's presence in the world. The Lord has come to care for the wounds created by our sinfulness, to heal, and bind them for us. Moreover, not only does He tend to our souls, He also places us within the care of Holy Mother the Church, the spiritual inn that provides us comfort and allows us to heal. With this understanding of the parable, we are reminded again of the need for intimacy with Christ. All things are accomplished through Him, with Him, in Him. It is true that we are called to charity, but our charity must be rooted in Christ who has shown us love and mercy. This intimacy with Christ which gives foundation to our charity is beautifully connected to the celebration today of St. Joachim, the mother of Our Lady. He is known to us because of his connection to Our Lady who always leads us back to Our Lord. Any success in the spiritual life must be explicitly rooted in deep and abiding union with Christ. Meditate on this great saint, this parable and the wisdom of our Savior which are made manifest in both word and deed. Thank God for His mercy and solicitude. Then, with grateful hearts, let us pledge to give to others that which we ourselves have received: compassion, mercy, and love.

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FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS DEVOTION

"Look My daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console Me and announce in My name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making Reparation to Me." *Our Lady to Lucia on December 10, 1925* In response to Our Lady's request for the devotion of reparation to her Immaculate Heart, all are invited to join us in reciting the Holy Rosary on First Saturdays at 7:40 am, finishing in time to allow for the additional 15 minutes of private meditation on any of the mysteries of the Rosary with the intention of making reparation to Our Lady. Confessions are available 7:00 am – 8:00 am; Mass begins at 8:15 am. Help Our Lady bring about peace in the world!

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THE ORATORY VESTIBULE

The Rector of the Oratory has requested that any materials left in the vestibule of the Oratory be approved before dissemination. This permission includes materials deemed pious and worthy by the individual leaving the materials. To the person(s) who continues to leave material related to the Miraculous Medal, please contact the Rector of the Oratory before leaving any more materials. The material that has been left has been collected and is being kept in the Oratory offices. This will continue to be the practice of any, and all, materials left in the vestibule or at the doors of the Church without permission: the material will be confiscated or disposed of completely.

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CELL PHONES

There has been an increasing number of cell phones ringing during Holy Mass. Please be sure to silence your cell phones before entering Church. Thank you for your cooperation.

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BLESSING OF ITEMS

As a reminder, the blessings of religious items will take place after the 8:00 am Holy Mass at St. Joseph Altar on the 2nd

Sunday of each month. Those who desire to have items blessed should bring them to the St. Joseph Altar **before** the 8:00 am Holy Mass with their names clearly marked on the items to be blessed. These items should be left on the St. Joseph Altar. If there are a large number of items, they can be placed around the altar but should not impede the distribution of Holy Communion. Two blessings will be given: one for rosaries and one for all other items grouped together. There is no need to take items from their packaging.

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ADULTS SEEKING THE SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We welcome those interested in becoming Catholic. To get started in that process within the OSGA community, please email one of our priests for an introductory meeting. Their contacts are available in the bulletin. After this, candidates for Initiation at the Oratory will be directed to complete a registration form with our Administrator.

Please register with the Oratory and confirm class times and days. Generally, catechumens who are actively in formation meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 4:00-5:15 pm in the St. Joseph Room (rectory basement). If you are not currently in formation and would like to begin attending the classes please contact the office.

The content surrounds a set of topics central to Catholic teaching, as set forth by Msgr. Morris. Deacon Pieper moderates most meetings through a question-and-answer format and hopes to promote sincere dialogue with the candidates regarding those topics and/or related questions. The intent is to communicate Christ and His Church. Sacraments are offered on an individual basis, on a rolling schedule throughout the year, after mutual discernment by the candidate, our deacon, and priests.

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RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For those in our community who are new to the Traditional Latin Mass, when you approach the altar rail for holy communion it is the custom to begin filling in the altar rail at the far right near St. Joseph's altar and fill in the rail until its end at the Marian altar. This practice is not impacted by which side of the Church you are seated. You are allowed, and encouraged, to switch sides in order to keep the communion line moving. This is particularly important when there are two sacred ministers distributing Holy Communion. So too, do not overly delay approaching the rail waiting for others to return to their pews. If everyone moves with attention to what is happening, there should be a flow of movement between those departing the altar rail and those approaching the altar rail. Also, for daily Holy Mass: please kneel at the rail only where the houseling cloth has been prepared for communion. Please keep in mind that we should not keep the Lord waiting but moving with grace and deliberation to the altar rail to receive our Eucharistic Lord.

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WHAT ARE STOLE FEES?

It is customary in the Catholic Church for the provision of the clergy to offer "stole fees," at baptisms, weddings, funerals, or the blessing of homes. These stipends form a part of the compensation for the clergy. Most priests don't want to

sound greedy or ungrateful, so stole fees are not often mentioned or taught about, but because people are not aware of them, the faithful usually find it helpful to learn that they do exist (and that the priests are grateful for your generosity!).

These fees are *not* obligatory but are given as a sign of appreciation and support for the clergy's work. The Catholic Church emphasizes that these fees should not be seen as payment for sacraments, which are free gifts of God. The clergy at the Oratory are particularly keen to make clear that no one who asks for a sacrament will ever be denied for lack of a stole fee.

In our archdiocese, there are suggested amounts that people usually give, and that information will be shared with you by the office when the event is scheduled. Thank you!

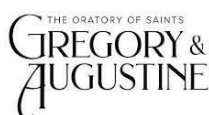
