#### HOLY WEEK FOR THE ORATORY

An information sheet is available to take home with you today that has the complete schedule for Holy Week here at the Oratory of Ss. Gregory and Augustine. In advance, thank you to everyone who has assisted in making our celebration of these holiest days possible. It is my hope and prayer that many of the faithful will have the opportunity to spend time with Our Lord during the Sacred Triduum.

#### **OCTAVE OF EASTER**

The Octave of Easter is one continual feast celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord and His victory over sin and death. By tradition, during the Octave no servile work was accomplished and the neophytes attended Holy Mass at a different stational Church in Rome for the reception of Holy Communion. In order to provide the faithful of the Oratory the opportunity to celebrate this great Octave, in addition to our normal Mass schedule, there will be the celebration of Holy Mass on the following days and times: Easter Monday at 12 Noon; Easter Friday at 12 Noon; Easter Saturday at 8:00. All of these times are preceded by the sacrament of Confession an hour before Holy Mass.

#### **HOLY MASS ON FRIDAYS**

It has been my desire to have Holy Mass offered every day at the Oratory. While that has not yet been realized, the Oratory will continue to celebrate Holy Mass on Fridays at 12 Noon with Confessions before at 11:00 am. Blessings to all those who were able to attend during the Lenten season. Please share the news of this sign of our continued growth with the larger community.

#### **AVAILABILITY OF CONFESSIONS**

The Oratory will return to its normal schedule after the Octave of Easter is complete. Confessions will continue to be available on Wednesday evenings at 5:30 pm, Friday mornings at 11 am, Sunday mornings at 7 am and on First Friday and First Saturday according to those schedules. **Unfortunately, at this time Confessions will not be heard at 10 am in the school building**. Understandably this was a convenient time for a number of individuals; however, the preparations necessary for the 11:30 am High Mass have necessitated this change. If the times listed above are not convenient for your schedule, please call the rectory and a time can be arranged for

confessions. If you desire anonymity for this process, Donna Mueller can assist you in arranging an appointment for confessions.

#### **OFFICE OF TENEBRAE**

"Tenebrae" is the name given to the service of Matins and Lauds belonging to the last three days of Holy Week and normatively anticipated the evening before. These services are marked by a somber and sober, nearly mournful praying of the Divine Office. The structure of the office is sparse reflecting the seriousness of these sacred days and the sadness that should accompany all of us because Christ our Savior suffered for our sins.

"On this and the two following days, the Church anticipates the Night-Office; she celebrates it on the previous evening of each day, and this in order that the Faithful may be present at it. The Matins and Lauds of Maundy Thursday are, therefore, said this afternoon. The Faithful should make every effort to assist at this solemn Office, seeing it is on their account that the Church has changed her usual hours. As to the merit there is in joining in it, there can be no doubt, but that it is to be preferred to any private devotions. The surest means for obtaining favors from God, and winning him to our requests, is to approach him through the Church. And as regards the feelings of devotion wherewith we ought to celebrate the mysteries of these three great Days, the Offices of the Church are, ordinarily speaking, a surer and richer source than the Exercises of Piety composed by men. The soul that feeds on the words and ceremonies of the holy Liturgy, will be all the more disposed to profit by the private devotions she practices at home. The prayer of the Church will thus become the basis, whereon is built the edifice of Christian piety during these glorious Anniversaries of our Redemption; and we shall be imitating our forefathers who lived in the Ages of Faith, and who were such admirable Christians, because they lived the life of the Church, by means of the sacred Liturgy." - Excerpted from the Liturgical Year by Abbot Gueranger.

- Wednesday, 17 April @ 10:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Thursday
- Thursday, 18 April @ 10:00 pm Tenebrae of Good Friday
- Friday, 19 April @ 10:00 pm Tenebrae of Holy Saturday

While this is late in the evening, I would encourage as many of the faithful to attend as possible. This will be a wonderful, solemn and profound way to enter more deeply into the Sacred Triduum and the Paschal Mystery which has brought us our salvation.
